Areas of concern

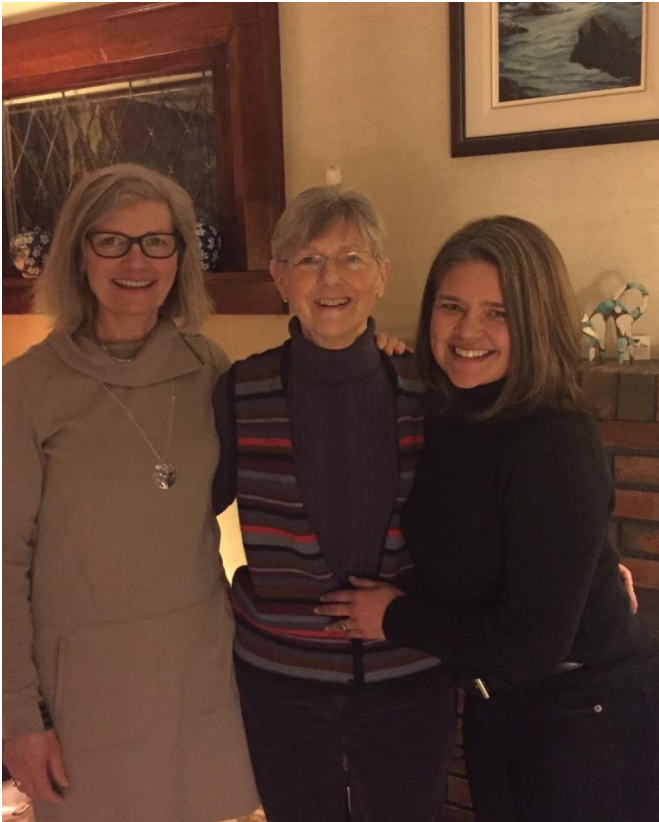
- Communications /Connectivity
